Overview

Our 5hr Safeguarding Designated Person L3 course sometimes referred to as Designated Safeguarding Officer. To access this course you must hold a L2 Advanced Safeguarding Qualification.

Who is this Course for?

This course is suitable for anyone who works with children and holds a management, supervisory or designated child protection role. The course is suitable for anyone who has some knowledge of safeguarding procedures. For those who are not a Designated Person or Lead Office should consider our 3hr L2 Safeguarding course

Aims of the Course

- On completion of this course learners will:
- Know the laws, policies and guidance documents that contribute towards best safeguarding and child protection practice.
- Understand their roles and responsibilities as the Designated Safeguarding Lead.
- Know how to recognise and respond to abuse appropriately and efficiently.
- Understand the framework for safeguarding and child protection, and how best to respond to children's differing levels of need under the framework.
- Know when and how to share information.
- Know how to take action, should they disagree with actions or decisions made.
- Understand the importance of recording and storing information.







Format

- This 5 hour course is delivered virtually in two sessions
- Learning takes place through a mix of presentations, group discussions and scenario planning
- We limit numbers to 14 people per course so that the instructor can ensure everyone is supported while they learn

- **Introduction:** Defining safeguarding and child protection, the importance of safeguarding training and responsibilities
- Safeguarding Framework and Guidance: Essential & statutory safeguarding legislation and the assessment process
- Your Responsibilities: The role of the Designated Person and your key responsibilities
- **Identify:** The barriers that prevent children and staff from reporting abuse or concerns and how to overcome these
- Recognise: Types of abuse, children with additional needs and vulnerabilities
- Sharing Information: Challenge and escalation, key principles for sharing information
- Recording Information: Recording information, practice reviews, your involvement and what happens next
