Course Preview



Location - Burns to the head, face, head, genitals, or around a limb are of particular concern


Depth - Use the diagrams opposite to gain an understanding of burn depth

TYPES OF BURN

Superficial only burns the outer layer of skin (red, tender and swollen) 

Partial thickness burns deeper into the tissues (blisters are visible) 

Full thickness multiple layers of tissue burnt away, (burn looks charred or waxy. It may not be painful as nerves burnt away.) 

To measure the size of a burn look at the casualty's palm - that is 1% of the body.

SIGNS & SYMPTOMS
See creature stings

See creature stings generally tend to be painful, itchy and produce a rash. Some may be stuck into the skin and jellyfish tentacles could be stuck to the skin.

See unfish sting

See all jellyfish in the UK sting, the ones that do can range from mild to severe stings.

man o' war sting

The Portuguese man o' war (jellyfish looking organism) is the most dangerous in the UK. These are becoming more common and can be deadly. **If stung seek urgent medical attention.**


TREATMENT OF MINOR CUTS AND GRAZES

Minor cuts and grazes are common, especially in the young. Put these instructions in the correct sequence and click **submit** when you're done.


MINOR INJURIES

Cover the injury using a plaster or other sterile dressing.

Irrigate the injury using clean running water or Saline. (Alcohol/Free water can also be used)
